


KITCHEN KORNER

Russian Tea Cookies

1 c. butter
1/2 c. powdered sugar
1 tsp. vanilla
2 1/4 c. flour
1/4 tsp. salt
3/4 c. finely chopped nuts

Mix ingredients in order given.
Roll dough into 1 in balls.
Place on ungreased cookie sheet.
Bake 8 min. at 375 degrees.
Roll in powdered sugar
while still warm.
Make 40 cookies
